The Campus Safety and University Operations Division will conduct a test of the ND Alert emergency notification system on **Tuesday**, **Sept. 24**, **at 10:50 a.m.** During the test, notification messages will be sent using:

- Text and voice notifications to registered faculty and staff mobile telephones
- Electronic mail to nd.edu addresses
- Activation of the campus public address system
- Activation of speakers on Cisco IP telephones (no calls will be made to office desk phones)

Prior to the test, please verify your emergency contact information and make any necessary updates using the "View and Update Emergency Contact(s)" task at <a href="inside.nd.edu">inside.nd.edu</a>. For assistance accessing <a href="inside.nd.edu">inside.nd.edu</a> contact the OIT Help Desk at (574) 631-8111.

In order to assess the public address system's coverage, both in buildings and outdoor areas, we ask your assistance in monitoring the public address alert. The University has implemented ND Alert, a comprehensive mass notification system, to communicate with campus constituents during an incident. It is through this system that we will be able to notify constituents in the event of an emergency. A complete description of the University's emergency response procedures is available by accessing the University's emergency website at emergency.nd.edu.

The University tests the ND Alert system at least once each semester. If you have any questions about this test, please contact us via e-mail at <a href="mailto:safety@nd.edu">safety@nd.edu</a>.

Our nation has experienced a number of active violence incidents over the past few months, and the University has received inquiries about whether the University is prepared and trains for these types of incidents. Please know that the Notre Dame Police Department and Notre Dame Fire Department train frequently for active violence situations, often with local police and fire partner agencies. University administrators also plan and train for large scale emergency situations.

University departments and work teams interested in meeting with NDPD about emergency planning and what individuals can do in the case of an active violence situations may contact Cpt. Robert Martinez at <a href="marti16@nd.edu">marti16@nd.edu</a>. NDPD and the Senior Director of Emergency Management will focus on active violence preparedness in 2019-20. We will systematically roll out to the entire University training on how to respond to and plan for all types of emergencies.
